A fundamental principle of eco-tourism is sustainability. By regulating tourist activities, **they** seek to prevent habitat destruction and biodiversity loss. Furthermore, eco-tourism initiatives often involve local residents in planning and management processes, thereby strengthening community participation and long-term economic stability.

However, the rapid expansion of eco-tourism has generated debate. Some businesses adopt environmentally friendly language in their advertising without implementing meaningful environmental practices. This strategy, widely known as “greenwashing,” **undermines** consumer trust and weakens conservation efforts. In the absence of strict monitoring and transparent standards, eco-tourism risks becoming indistinguishable from the mass tourism it originally sought to reform.

Despite these concerns, many environmental scholars argue that eco-tourism remains a **viable** pathway toward sustainable development. When supported by effective regulatory frameworks and responsible tourist behaviour, it can contribute to conservation funding, environmental education, and cross-cultural understanding. Ultimately, the success of eco-tourism depends not only on policies but also on the ethical commitment of travellers and businesses alike.
